SPECIALITY WELDS RECEIVES RECOGNITION BY IMAREST.

The Institute of Marine Engineering, Science and Technology (IMarEST) has formally recognised the underwater welding programme "Weldcraft-Pro", developed and managed by AWD member Speciality Welds.

Speciality Welds offers Weldcraft-pro to commercial diver training schools and other specialist training organisations as a 'self-teach' programme. Providers involved with commercial diver training now have the opportunity to deliver approved/recognised welder training, together with international certification.

Training follows the International Institute of Welding (IIW) and European Welding Federation (EWF) guidelines for fillet welding and culminates in approval to ISO 15618-1, or AWS D3.6 welder qualifications.

Mr. David Keats, MD of Speciality Welds said, "This programme is the only one available, anywhere in the world, that provides an opportunity for commercial diver training organisations serious about equipping divers with appropriate welding skills, to meet assessed competency standards that meet industry requirements".

PM WELCOMES NISSAN INVESTMENT

Gordon Brown has welcomed plans for Nissan to invest more than £200 million in a new battery factory in the UK and create up to 350 jobs.

The car manufacturer will produce rechargeable lithium-ion batteries for its greener hybrid cars at its plant in Sunderland, which will become its European Centre of Excellence for Battery Manufacturing.

The announcement came as Prime Minister and Business Secretary Lord Mandelson visited the factory to reveal that the North East will become a Low Carbon Economic Area specialising in ultra-low carbon vehicles.

CONSTRUCTION OF BIGGEST EVER BRITISH WARSHIP BEGINS



The construction of the Royal Navy's new aircraft carriers started on Wednesday 8th July, when HRH the Princess Royal performed the steel cutting for the first of the Queen Elizabeth aircraft carriers at BVT Surface Fleet's shipyard in Govan, Glasgow.

Guided by Scott Ballingal, a 21 year old BVT apprentice from Erskine who will be working on the Carriers, Rear Admiral the Princess Royal pushed the button to start the computer guided laser that cut the first piece of steel for the hull.

Scott is one of 70 new apprentices who have been taken on by BVT to support work on the carrier.

Three other major sections (called lower blocks) of the ship will be assembled at yards at Portsmouth and Rosyth. Other fabrication work will be done at the Appledore shipyards in Devon. Each block will be transported to Rosyth dockyard where they will be joined together to form the hull of the ship.
